The daytime ceremony marked the culmination of months of hard work. In the evening, some 150 presenters, supporters, and dignitaries gathered in the school to continue the celebration and tour our new building.

Three local businesses sponsored the two studios and the building as a whole. It was amazing to get this level of support from business as well as contributions from individuals.

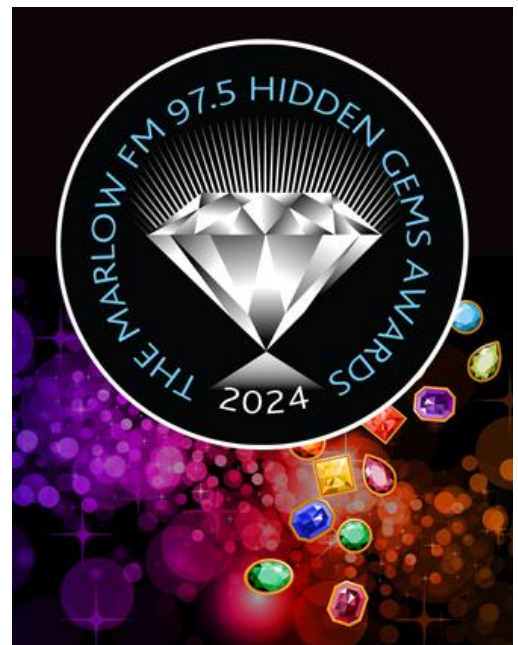


## Marlow FM's Hidden Gems of 2024 revealed

## Making the move from Marlow Library

After we left our original location in 2023, Marlow Library was our temporary home while we raised money for, and built, our new studios at Great Marlow School. We made friends and great contacts while we were there, but the single upstairs room wasn't a long-term solution. It was a technical feat to keep on air while moving all our equipment to the school, but we pulled it off without missing a single programme.



## Opening up the airwaves to the next generation

This year we started to fulfil our ambition to get younger voices on air, largely because of the convenience of our new home at Great Marlow School.

Drama teacher Stuart Ross appeared as a guest on Marlow FM in November 2024. Inspired by the

experience, he joined the station as a presenter himself, and saw an opportunity to bring his students with him. His energy and rapport with young people made him a natural choice to lead a new show from the school site. *Stuart on Sunday*, tagged with the line *Sir on Monday*, launched at the beginning of June 2025.

We also have a strong link with Marlow's other secondary school, Sir William Borlase's Grammar School. This year we did an outside broadcast from their 400th birthday party. Both schools have joined forces through the Marlow Education Trust, making cooperation easier.





## App update increases listener interaction

This year we added a new feature to our app. Listeners can now record a voice message inside the app and send it straight to our studios for the presenter to play out on air. This has proved very popular! But if you're shy, you can send us a text message from inside the app instead.

The Marlow FM app is maintained by one of our volunteers, who codes for a hobby.

In other tech news, we also introduced an Alexa Skill for the first time. This means listeners can play Marlow FM on Amazon smart speakers even faster, without hearing lots of ads from TuneIn first.

## What Marlow FM is all about

- We serve all the people of Marlow, Buckinghamshire and the surrounding area, whatever their background or age. We aim to have a programme for everyone.
- We provide opportunities for local residents and organisations to get their voice heard, tell their story, or publicise their event.
- Everyone at the station is a volunteer. Some 80 presenters produce just over 100 hours of local content a week - that's more than 14 hours a day.
- Each year we do at least 10 outside broadcasts and events.
